Causes of Social Isolation

- Smartphones (recommend personal research)
- Social Media Addictions
- Loss of a Loved One
- Physical Impairments
- Fear of rejection
- COVID social restrictions (especially youth)
- Perceived Social Status
- Distrust of religious people and spiritual events
- History of abuse and bullying
- Chemical and other Addictions

Dangers of Social Isolation

- Loss of sense of purpose
- Discourage family love of Jesus' lifestyle
- Failure to lead family: Passive
- Abuse of family: physical and emotional
- Use of addictive drugs
- Food and Alcohol addiction
- Pornography use and addiction
- Unfaithful marriage relationships
- Children who actively look for secular role models

- Continued...
 - Be careful to do what is right in the eyes of everybody
 - If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone
 - · Do not take revenge. Leave room for God's wrath
 - It is mine to avenge: I will repay, says the Lord
 - On the contrary
 - If you enemy is hungry, feed him
 - If he is thirsty, give him something to drink
 - In doing this you will heap burning coals on his head
 - Do not be overcome by evil but overcome evil with good
 - Cognitive Dissonance
 - · When good is done when evil is expected, the enemy is confused
 - Why did my enemy do good things for me?
 - Because a healthy mind can't keep two opposing views as "true" at the same time.
 - Our love for God and our Neighbor becomes self-evident.
